Notes from our President Jim McDermott



The VARC Board of Directors held their fall meeting in Fremont, Ohio on October 28th, 2017. The Board addressed several items for the upcoming year. This included changes to the organization's bylaws and rules. Changes to the bylaws and rules that were approved will be posted on the website soon. A new position was proposed for a Director of Marketing. Bill Layton was elected for this very important job. That left the Vice President's position open. John Morton was nominated and approved with a unanimous vote to fill this spot. Congratulation to the new appointees!

If you have any ideas on how we can get additional sponsorship give Bill Layton a call. In order for VARC to grow and attract new members we need funding to carry out our mission.

There was also discussion of next year's schedule. The number of events was discussed and a proposal was made to limit the VARC sanctioned events to 12 shows, for which points will be awarded. Other optional shows can be listed on the schedule as open events or events sponsored by other vintage racing groups where VARC members are invited to participate. We are looking for your input on this. We must remember that our goal is to present our" Traveling Museum" of vintage racing cars to the fans. In order to accomplish this mission we need an adequate car count.

We are also looking to work with promoters and when possible split our cars into groups by type. This will make our on track "exhibition races" more representative of the type of racing that was carried on in the past. This however requires a sufficient number of the various car types to commit to our shows. If we can get a commitment from you as to which shows you would like to see and how many you will be able to make we can work with the various promoters and try to arrange this. The life blood of this organization is your participation, which was very good last season and we hope to even better in 2018.

We need your feedback so give this some thought and let us know how you feel about these proposals. What are your favorite tracks? How many shows do you plan on attending? What will make it more likely that you will attend more shows? Send your thoughts to us so we can have the best information when we start our scheduling. We have members scattered over a wide area and that is taken into consideration when working out our schedule.

The Board of Directors approved a new sponsorship/membership structure for 2018. VARC has to grow and expand our traveling museum. Unfortunately, this is not always a low-cost endeavor. There are a number of revenue-generating projects being planned, but we need your help as well. One main contributor to our operating funds is membership dues. See the note from Dori in this newsletter for more information

The annual banquet -awards presentation was held that evening after the meeting. I can't say enough about the hard work that was put into making this a great night. If you have not attended one of our banquets you owe it to yourself to put it on your list of fun things to do. We have already scheduled the hall for next year and look to make it bigger and better.

Stay tuned for additional information on scheduling and other issues that we are working on. A revised point system was discussed and work is being done to make it more fair to all members with the thought that it will encourage additional participation. Any ideas are welcome. The Board of Directors will

review any suggestions and determine if it will help our mission. So once again get back to us with your thoughts. If you have any proposal write them out and send it to me. I will present them to the directors for their action. I am already looking forward to next season and have one track promoter offering us dates to pick from. I think our program is worthwhile and entertaining as well as educational. Hope to see you at a track in 2018. Thank You.

Notes from our Secretary Dori Ordos

In order to support our mission of educating the public on the history of automobile racing, VARC has to grow and expand our traveling museum. Unfortunately, this is not always a low-cost endeavor. There are a number of revenue-generating projects being planned, but we need your help as well.

One main contributor to our operating funds is membership dues. For years, all members have paid a \$25 membership fee, with a \$5 penalty if received after the first of the year. In following with our current tax exempt status, VARC is now offering two levels of sponsorship (membership). We have a number of dedicated members who do not have vintage race cars. These members provide both financial and moral support to the club and they are greatly appreciated. These members are our associate sponsors. Dues for an associate sponsorship will remain at \$25 if paid before January 1, \$30 if paid after that. All associate sponsors will receive a VARC decal, so they can show their support for VARC. Members who run / exhibit their vintage race cars are known as full sponsors. Full sponsors are eligible to receive two free pit passes at every VARC-sponsored event. Dues for full sponsorship are \$50 if paid before January 1, \$55 if paid after that.

If an associate sponsor acquires a vintage race car during the season, they can start participating in VARC-

sponsored events by upgrading to a full sponsorship, for an additional \$25.

VARC always welcomes new members! We will accept either associate sponsor (\$25) or full sponsor (\$50) members at any time during the year. Just remember that sponsorships are not pro-rated. All sponsorships run for one year, from November 1 through October 31, regardless of when they are paid.



Now old man Ford was more than just a little opposed to this, and there was no way he was going to put the Goldberg's name on two million Ford cars. They haggled back and forth for about two hours and finally agreed on \$4 million dollars and that their first names would be shown.

And so, even to this day, all Ford air conditioners show the names "Norm, Hi, Lo, Max" on the controls.






